WHY DOES THE PLASTIC STRAW MATTER?

- Plastic straws are among the top 10 plastic items found in beach & town cleanups.
- Most plastic straws are NOT recyclable.
- Single-use plastics, such as straws, persist in the environment, harm wildlife & enter the food chain as they are mistaken for food.
- Over time, plastics breakdown into small pieces, known as "microplastics," which have been found locally in the Snake River & globally throughout aquatic ecosystems, including the deepest parts of the oceans.
- Microplastics aren't just in our waters, but in the air - at the top of pristine mountains.
- Humans are believed to inhale & consume 10s of 1000's of microplastics per year.
- Each plastic straw eliminated from the waste stream represents a small, but important, step toward a larger impact on global environmental health.
